The Environmental Benefits of Building with Concrete

There is a national trend toward the use of “green” building techniques to create sustainable and environmentally friendly buildings and developments. This trend has led to the development of the LEED Certification. LEED stands for the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design and it represents the U.S. Green Building Council’s effort to provide a national standard for “green buildings”. This rating system is intended to be used as a design guideline to improve occupant well-being, environmental performance, sustainability, durability, and economic returns of buildings using established and innovative practices, standards and technology. This program is designed to educate designers about how ready mixed concrete can be used to contribute towards LEED certification. This seminar will discuss how the use of insulating concrete forms, pervious concrete, concrete parking lots and other concrete applications can contribute points towards this certification. It will also discuss such topics as urban heat islands, storm water management, life cycle costs, recycled materials and the use of reflective surfaces in designing “green” developments.
